**Things to
remember
about the
Living Water**

1. To receive it, we need to feel the thirst

- “As the deer pants for streams of water, so my soul pants for you, O God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God” *Psalm 42:1-2*
- “...God, you are my God, earnestly I seek you; my soul thirsts for you, my body longs for you, in a dry and weary land where there is no water” *Psalm 63:1*
- “I spread out my hands to You; my soul longs for You like a thirsty land” *Psalm 143:6*
- “Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled” *Matthew 5:6*

2. He is the only one who gives it

- It is not in pleasures: “Come now, I will test you with mirth; therefore enjoy pleasure; but surely, this also *was* vanity” *Ecclesiastes 2:1*
- It is not in wine: “I searched in my heart *how* to gratify my flesh with wine” *Ecclesiastes 2:3*
- It is not in career and success: “I made my works great, I built myself houses, and planted myself vineyards” *Ecclesiastes 2:4*

2. He is the only one who gives it

- It is not in possessions: “I acquired male and female servants, and had servants born in my house. Yes, I had greater possessions of herds and flocks than all who were in Jerusalem before me”

Ecclesiastes 2:7

3. Going to Him and...drinking

- “If anyone thirsts, let him come to Me and drink”
John 7:37
- How many times have we gone to Him, but did not drink?
