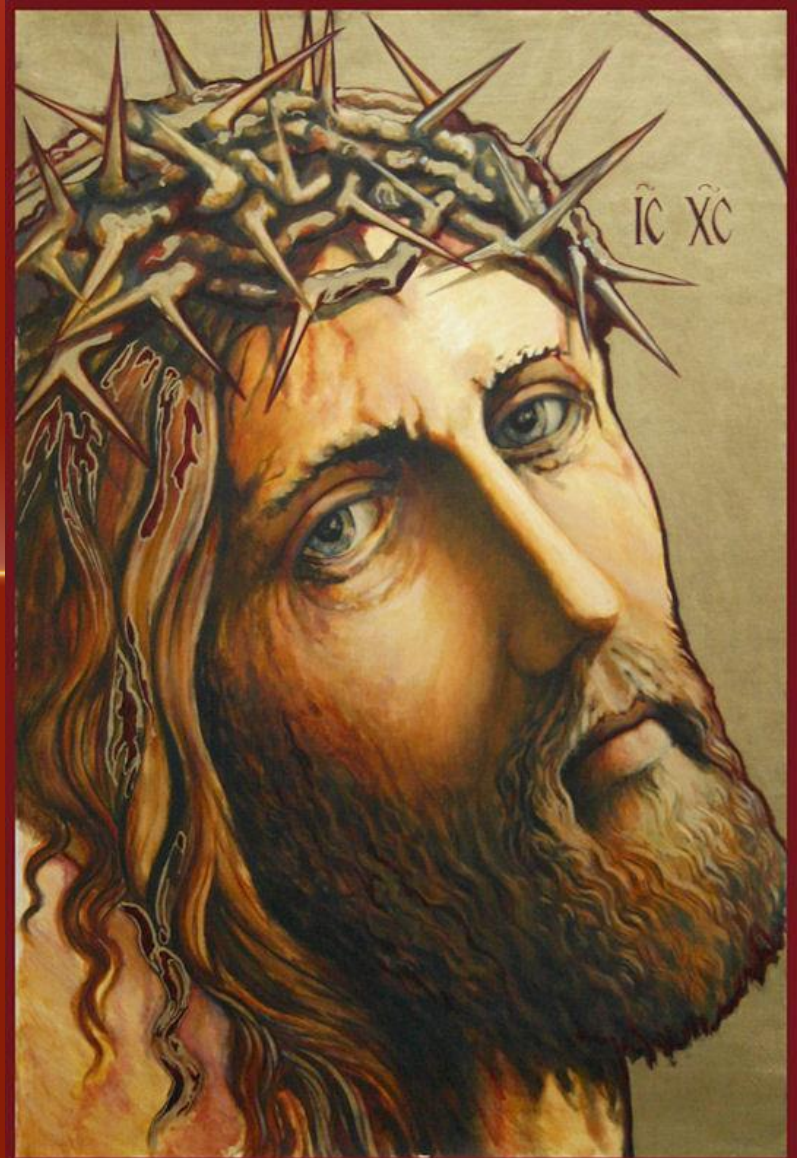

BETWEEN THE OLD AND THE NEW ⁽¹⁾

1. The battle by the tree of knowledge of good and evil:

- Adam was defeated by the tree while Christ, the Second Adam brought us to victory by the tree of the Cross

2. The Sixth Day: Adam who was created on the sixth day, was also restored on the same day.



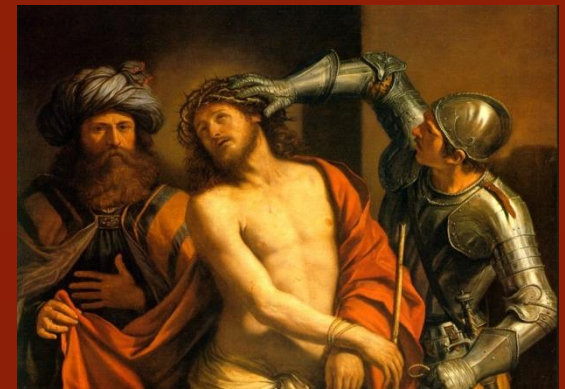
BETWEEN THE OLD AND THE NEW (2)

3. The reproaches of Satan:

“The reproaches of those who reproached You fell on Me.”

Romans 15:3

- “Man meditated the sin by his mind, loved it with his heart, walked to it with his feet, stretched his hands and took the fruit, ate it and betrayed You!”



BETWEEN THE OLD AND THE NEW (3)

4. Death that man swallowed into his nature:

- “Death is swallowed up in victory.”

1 Corinthians 15:54



5. The abused freedom: “He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross” Philippians 2:8

6. The closed garden:

- “Assuredly, I say to you, today you will be with Me in Paradise.”

Luke 23:43

7. The middle wall between God and man:

“Then, behold, the **veil** of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom”

Matthew 27:51

8. The lost way back to God's presence:

“Therefore, brethren, having boldness to enter the Holiest by the blood of Jesus, by a new and living way which He consecrated for us, through the veil, that is, His flesh”

Hebrews 10:19-20



BETWEEN THE OLD AND THE NEW (6)

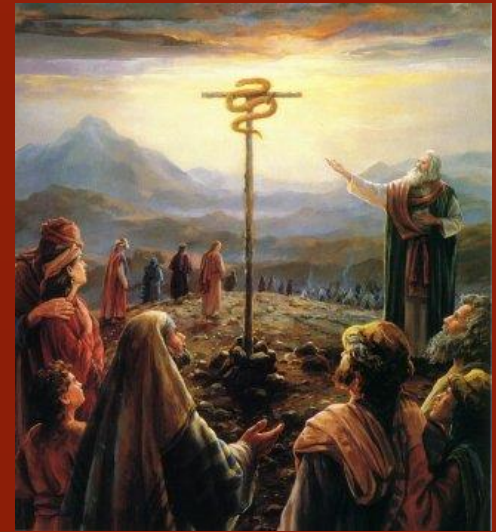
9. The Serpent:

- “So the LORD God said to the serpent:
‘Because you have done this, You are cursed
more than all cattle’” **Genesis 3:14**

- “So Moses made a bronze serpent, and put
it on a pole; and so it was, if a serpent had
bitten anyone, when he looked at the
bronze serpent, he lived” **Numbers 21:9**

- “And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the
wilderness, even so must the Son of Man be
lifted up, ¹⁵ that whoever believes in Him
should not perish but have eternal life”

BETWEEN THE OLD AND THE NEW (7)

10. The Bride:

- “And the LORD God caused a deep sleep to fall on Adam, and he slept; and He took one of his ribs, and closed up the flesh in its place” **Genesis 2:21**

- From Christ's side, came the Bride; the Church

- “For we are members of His body, of His flesh and of His bones” **Ephesians 5:30**



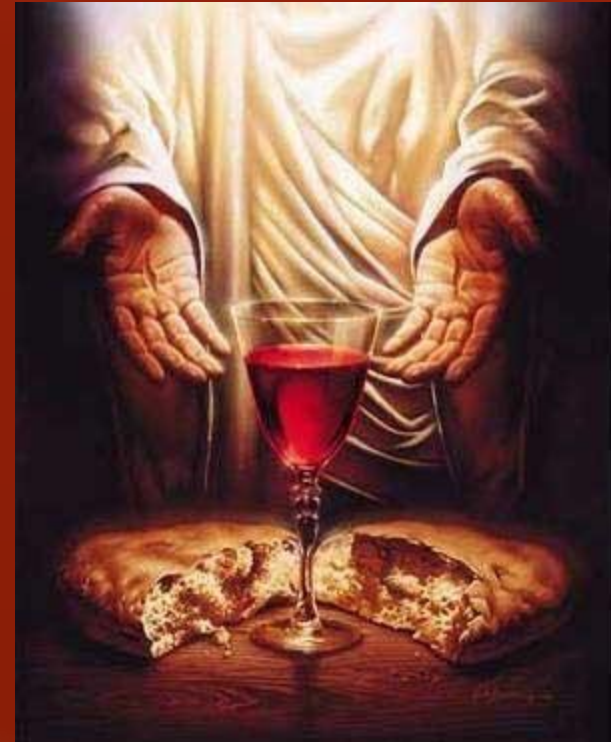
BETWEEN THE OLD AND THE NEW (8)

BETWEEN THE OLD AND THE NEW (9)

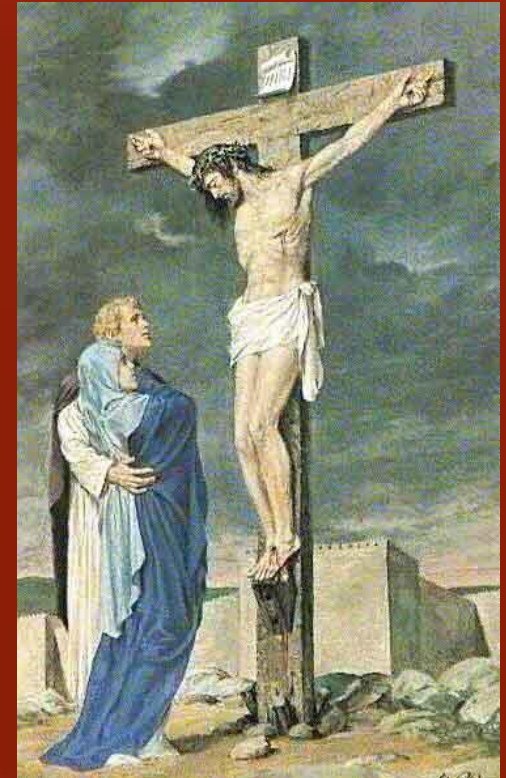
13. The mother full of grace:

- “Cursed is the ground for your sake”

Genesis 3:17

- “Then He said to the disciple,

‘Behold your mother!’” **John 19:27**



THE HOPE OF RENEWAL (1)

- The renewed nature through Baptism and Repentance
- The renewed spiritual youth for those who wait upon Him: “But those who wait on the Lord shall renew their strength; They shall mount up with wings like eagles, They shall run and not be weary, They shall walk and not faint” **Isaiah 40:31**
