- It is only the Lord's great love for man that moved Him to promise such a great and unthinkable salvation




#### SOLOMON

#### THE PRODIGAL SON



#### THE PUBLICAN

- "I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other"
   Luke 18:14
- His humble approach to the temple gave him this favor in God's eyes



#### THE RIGHT-HAND THIEF

- He received the promise of accompanying the Lord in Paradise after his request even without a word of rebuke or questioning his previous acts.
- His confession of his wrongdoing, his
  acknowledgment of the Lordship of the Master at
  the time of apparent weakness, and his only plea
  to be saved are some of the reasons behind the
  gift.
