The Purpose of Speaking in Tongues

- Definition: a gift of the Holy Spirit by which a believer is given the ability to speak in a foreign language without having been taught it beforehand.
- It was given to them to make evangelizing possible and effective.
 - "Others mocking said, 'They are full of new wine."
 (Acts 2:13)
 - "Therefore tongues are for a sign, not to those who believe but to unbelievers..." (1 Cor. 14:22)

The Purpose of Speaking in Tongues

- Translation is necessary
 - "So likewise you, unless you utter by the tongue words easy to understand, how will it be known what is spoken? For you will be speaking into the air. There are, it may be, so many kinds of languages in the world, and none of them is without significance. Therefore, if I do not know the meaning of the language, I shall be a foreigner to him who speaks, and he who speaks will be a foreigner to me... Therefore let him who speaks in a tongue pray that he may interpret." (1 Cor. 14:9-11,13)

Is this gift still active in the Church?

- "Love never fails. But whether there are prophecies, they will fail; whether there are tongues, they will cease..." (1 Cor. 13:8)
 - It was given to the apostles for the purpose of communicating with foreigners
- God wants man to participate in His work of salvation in the way he is able, and God will do what man cannot.

Final Remarks

- The gift of tongues was not a common gift
- It is not the greatest gift
 - "...he who prophesies is greater than he who speaks with tongues, unless indeed he interprets, that the church may receive edification." (1 Cor. 14:5)
- Speaking in Tongues is not associated with a high level of spirituality
