   David into an enemy

Thought of Elijah as an enemy:

"So Ahab said to Elijah,
'Have you found me, O
my enemy?'"

1 Kings 21:20



#### King Ahab (2)

 Elijah confronted Ahab for what he did to Naboth and condemned him for his evil ways



### King Ahab (3)

 He also thought of Micaiah the son of Imla as an enemy: "I hate him, because he never prophesies good concerning me, but always evil" 2 Chronicles 18:7




#### King Ahab (4)

- Micaiah never flattered
   Ahab and told him the truth
- He was keen to let Ahab
  live in reality and not to
  believe the false prophets



#### Rehoboam (1)

- He started his reign with a united and prosperous kingdom
- He turned the people of Israel
   against himself when he
   answered them with cruelty,
   inconsideration and arrogance



#### Rehoboam (2)

 "My father made your yoke heavy, but I will add to your yoke; my father chastised you with whips, but I will chastise you with scourges!"

#### Jacob

- He was one of the reasons that turned his older children to be enemies to his son Joseph
- He favored Joseph and differentiated between him and his brothers in treatment
