

 Goal in SS service: bring kids closer to the Lord Christ, to develop a lifelong deep/intimate relationship with our Lord.







- Must also serve them outside of Church

# Phone Calls: Always first Step Calling kids at home - Great way of initiating a relationship with them

- If kid is absent, call at home to check up
- Let them know you missed them and would like to see them

- Ideas to initiate relationship on the phone
  - School: for kids from 1st 9th grade, this topic will be most dominant
  - Work (10<sup>th</sup> grade and above)
  - (most import line in your life)
  - Exciting things in their life

Ex: Getting Driver's License









- starting college (staying home/dorm)
- honors and achievements,
- hobbies and school activities, etc...)







**Hobbies** 







- Social things how they spend free time, trips, vacations, relatives that they have visited or seen recently, etc...
- Special Recognition














#### Do Not's

a. Text:

I tell a joke





I get LOL

The sheep knows the Shepherd by his voice (his voice not his text)



- b. Let them feel guilty for not coming to church. Avoid Lecturing and Scolding
  - c. Start call by "come to church"
  - d. Phone call too short

- Make child feel cared for; show interest
- At least a short conversation
- End phone call on a positive note, (miss them/see them soon)
- Always find a way to reach out to the kid (if he/she does not have a phone or does not answer, call the parents and ask to speak to them)

#### ■ Visitations:

Probably the most important and deepest element of Sunday School service.

Foundational element of one-on-one service to children (they never forget it) (story of Abouna visiting me)

The Nabil way (non-fasting days/dinner)








- Goal is to visit each child in the class once per year
- Let child know that you want to visit and arrange visitations with parents early
- This usually makes parents/child excited and gives them time to be prepared.

#### On a Serious Note:

Try to be aware of any family issues (separated/hardships/tragedy/etc.)

Ask Abouna for advice with special circumstances

- Tips for Visitations:
- Sit with the child and his/her parents together, or if the child requests, sit alone with the child
- Casual conversations about work, school, hobbies/interest/talents/etc...
- Make child and family feel very relaxed



Goal to become the child's friend. Speak face to face as a friend. We read in the Holy Bible: "God spoke to Moses face to face as a man speaks to his friend" (Exodus 33:11)

- Develop type of friendship with child so they seek your mentorship/guidance in life
- Talk on the child's level, never make them feel inferior, that you are more sophisticated/knowledgeable than them





- After initial casual conversation, turn to spiritual topics
  - Prayer/reading Bible/attending church/taking communion/confession/attending Sunday School
- Bring a spiritual gift for child
  - Bible, Icon, Agpeya, etc...
- Read a small passage from the Bible and briefly discuss it
- End the visitation with prayer

- Retreats:
- Vital in spiritual upbringing of children
- Often fondest memories for a child
- Perhaps deepest impact on a child's life

Goal to have at least two retreats a year



- Make retreats creative by having lessons as well as fun activities
- Get to know kids by participating in the activities. Spend time/talk with them.





- Be a true role model
- Let kids enjoy some flexibility as long as within the retreat rules

Outings:





- Include taking your Sunday School kids to a park, picnic, museum, zoo, etc...
- Try and get to know them and socialize with them

## Outings:

- Take an interest in their life. Be casual and relaxed. Not every conversation needs to be centered or focused on Church.
- Find out the hobbies and interests of the child, what their talents are, etc...


