

## Modes of Spiritual Learning

- ➤ Visual/Taste/Smell/Touch: How did the Early Church utilize visual means to express theological realities?
- ► Listening/Hearing: "So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God." Romans 10: 17
- ► Reading: "Till I come, give attention to reading, to exhortation, to doctrine." 1 Timothy 4:13
- ► Experiential: "Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, not as in my presence only, but now much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling"- Philippians 2:12
- Everyone Learns Differently (visual vs. listening vs. reading vs. experiential)
- Liturgy is the Totality of All the Above



# Why is healthy spiritual/psychological development important?

- Seeds of future personality development, interactions with others, and formation of their own families
- ► The number one predictor of future behavior is past behavior!
- Lays foundation for discipline and spiritual practices
- When does development begin? Before birth, and role of Parents (Jeremiah 1:5)
- Church Synaxarion
- Everything we do is a result of a defense mechanism that likely had origins from Childhood development
- Mystery of the Incarnation: Christ our God blessed development
- Goal of the Parent and Servant: To Feed Spiritually According to what they are able to eat
- Development is Everything! Our Goal is to produce Saints


### Categories of Development

- BIOLOGICAL
- PSYCHOLOGICAL
- SOCIAL
- SPIRITUAL

#### 4 Months


- Social/Emotional: Smiles, Looks at You, Makes Sounds Back When you Talk to Him/Her
- ► Early Age Child Looks and Sees Everything we do

#### 6 Months

Begins to know familiar people

#### 9 Months

- Begin to show facial expressions emotions (happy, angry, sad, and surprised)
- Stranger Anxiety; Reacts when you Leave
- Smiles or Laughs When You Play




#### 1 Year

- Plays games, Calls parents "mama" or "baba"
- Understands "No" at this age, stops and responds when they hear it

Begins putting things in containers and playing more and more active

#### 15 Months-18 Months

- Begins copying other children
- Shows affection (hugs, kisses)
- Begins to follow directions
- Points to Ask for Something when they need help
- Understanding of Differences in Gender!



#### 2 Year Olds


- Notices when others are hurt or upset, like pausing or looking sad when someone is crying
- Looks at your face to see how to react in a new situation

#### 30 Months

- Plays next to other children and sometimes plays with them
- Shows you what she can do by saying, "Look at me!"
- Follows simple routines when told
- Speaking more, Uses things to pretend, like feeding a block to a doll as if it were food
- Problem Solving Skills

#### 3 Years

- Very conversational back and forth frequent consistent exchanges
- Talks well enough for others to understand
- Avoids danger when you tell them (hot stove)




### Final Thoughts

- Importance of Development from Very Early On
- Discipline infused with Love
- Providing Spiritual Nourishment and Education Early On
- Do not underestimate the Spiritual capabilities of the developing child
- Importance of Secure Attachments will lead to Secure Relationship with God, Church and Others

# 15<sup>th</sup> of Epep-Martyrdom of St. Cyriacus (Three Years Old)

- "The martyr Cyriacus considered to be the youngest martyr to confess the Lord Christ after the children of Bethlehem"
- "The first words that she taught him to say were "I am a Christian!"
- "What you said cannot be accepted by a three year old child. The governor, said to her 'We can ask your child'. God made the child Cyriacus talk, who cried out saying, "Your gods are made of stone and wood by the hands of Men and there is no other God except my Lord Jesus Christ"
- "Governor tried to embrace him and kiss him, he pushed him away, and hit Him and instead of crying said "I am a Christian. I am a Christian"
- St. Cyriacus was martyred first, and his mother rejoiced and thank the Lord! Then St. Julitta was martyred.
- This is the goal of Holy Orthodox Child Development!
