Orthodox Praising

- Essential feature of the Orthodox Church
 - Coptic: Kiahk, Pascha, Apocalypse, Daily Praises
- Has many forms
- Related to the church's:
 - history, culture, and doctrine.
- Different forms, same goal: Praise God
- Oh come, let us <u>sing</u> to the Lord!
 Let us <u>shout joyfully</u> to the Rock
 of our salvation. Let us come
 before His presence with <u>thanksgiving</u>;
 Let us <u>shout joyfully</u> to Him with psalms.
 (Ps 95:1-2)

The Name of the Lord

- Orthodox praise is focused on glorifying the name of Christ
 - "The <u>name</u> of the Lord is a strong tower;
 The righteous run to it and are safe." (Prov 18:10)
- Repetitive joyous mediation and contemplation on the Name of the Lord
- "Jesus Prayer": a simple praise

Seven times everyday, I will praise <u>Your name</u>, **my Lord Jesus**, help me. O how beloved, is <u>Your holy name</u>, **my Lord Jesus**, help me. (Sunday Psali)

Remembering Your <u>holy name</u>, brings joy to souls, O **my Lord Jesus Christ**, my good Savior. (Saturday Psali)

For truly I approached, a great Prince, which is the <u>name of salvation</u>, of **our Lord Jesus Christ**. **Our Lord Jesus Christ**, gave a <u>sign</u> to His servants, who do fear him...

This is the <u>name of salvation</u>, of **our Lord Jesus Christ**, and His life-giving Cross, which He was crucified upon. (*Friday Psali*)

Communal Praise

- Λειτουργία (leitourgia) "work for the people"
 - "litos ergos" or "public service".
 - All must be involved in the work
 - People <u>called</u> out for a certain purpose,
 <u>separated</u> from everyone else, to <u>offer</u> praise to God.
- Every service is a "liturgy"
 - Liturgy of the Eucharist
 - Liturgy of the Waters
 - Liturgy of the Baptism
 - Liturgy of the Crowning



Communal Praise

- A priest can't pray any liturgy alone.
 - Priest, deacon, congregation
 - Story: Palm Sunday during COVID; Fr. Mina's first "blizzard" liturgy
- All liturgy prayers are accompanied with congregation hymns/responses
 - No "long" isolated priest prayers
 - No "deacons/choir" hymns congregat
- Hymns are in the nominative form: we, us
 - Through the intercessions, of the Theotokos Saint Mary, O Lord grant <u>us</u> the forgiveness of our sins.
 - We look for the resurrection of the dead...
 - <u>We</u> worship Your holy Body

Dogmatic Praise

- We believe in the Orthodox faith
 - We praise with this faith
- Doctrine is chanted more than lectured
 - We chant our faith
 - It becomes established in our hearts
 - Every church hymn is a chanted creed
 - Who repelled Arius?

Penitent Praise

- In Orthodox prayers three words:
 - Am/n All/louia Kurie e~le/~con.
 - Amen... Alleluia... Kyrie-layson (Lord have mercy)



- Continuous faith
 - Part of our constant praise

Alleluia (hallū yāh), "praise ye Jah!"

- Joy in God's gifts and benevolences.
 - Especially His life-giving sacraments.

Kyrie-layson (Lord, have mercy)

Continuous heartly request for mercy.

No one can praise sincerely if he is not:

a believer (Amen), and a repentant (Kyrie-layson)

To praise (Alleluia)... We must also master the words: Amen and Kyrie-layson.



Life of Repentance Life of Praise

- "Deliver me from blood, O God, The God of my salvation, And my tongue shall rejoice in Your righteousness. O Lord, open my lips, And my mouth shall declare Your praise." (Ps 51)
- "Have mercy on me, and hear my prayer...
 You have put gladness in my heart...
 I will both lie down in peace, and sleep;
 For You alone, O Lord, make me dwell in safety." (Ps 4)
- Alleluia. I shall go in, unto the altar of God, before the face of God, who gives gladness to my youth. I will confess to You, O God, my Go with a harp. Remember O Lord, David and all his meekness. Alleluia. (Hymn: All/louia eiei)
- Our mouth is filled with gladness and our tongue with rejoicing from our partaking of Your immortal Mysteries, O Lord... (Thanksgiving at the end of the Liturgy)

Humble Praise

- Orthodox praise raises the person to feel the divine presence, and the presence of angels and saints.
 - Increases awe and reverence -> Humility
 - Helps us to focus and not be distracted.
 - We become less absorbed in sound, music and more in meanings, contemplations and prayers
- "You are He whom the angels praise and the archangels worship... You are He unto whom the thrones send up the honor... (Anaphora of St Gregory)
- "...Raise your eyes toward the East: To see the Altar, and the Body and Blood of Immanuel our Lord placed upon it. The angels and archangels are standing...praising in one voice..." (long Acpazecye)

Being Orthodox: Praising

- Praising is the longing of the struggling church to enjoy the taste of eternity and the fellowship of the victorious church.
 - Praises are seized moments from eternity
 - As Orthodox believers we chant as we are excited, zealous, and waiting for this heavenly destiny.

 - For the Name of the Lord
 - Communal Praise
 - Dogmatic Praise
 - Penitent Praise
 - Humble Praise
